1. World Curling Federation (WCF) rules apply, unless otherwise indicated below or explained at the Team Meeting (11:30 in the venue, Friday, 20 April).
2. The Senior Women (16 teams) will be in two groups and each group will play a single round robin series. At the end of the round robin series there will be a ranking for 1st, 2nd and 3rd position in each group. The 1st ranked teams advance to the semi-finals, while WA2 will play WB3 and WA3 will play WB2 to determine the last teams in the semi-finals. For the semi-finals, if there are two teams from each group, the top ranked team of one group plays the lower ranked team of the other group; if there are three teams from the same group, the top ranked team from that group plays the lowest ranked team from the same group. The winners of the semi-finals play in the Gold medal game and the losers of the semi-finals play in the Bronze medal game.
3. The Senior Men (28 teams) are placed into four groups of 7 teams. Each group plays a round robin series. At the end of the round robin series there will be a ranking for 1st, 2nd and 3rd position in each group. The 1st ranked teams qualify directly for the 1/4 finals. The other two teams from each group are placed into qualification games according to the attached play-off chart, which will be used for the rest of the play-off games.
4. All games will be eight (8) ends, with extra end(s) to break tied games.
5. There will be a nine (9) minute practice for each team before each round robin game. The practice starts 30 minutes before the scheduled game time. Men: The team with dark stones practice first. Women: Dark stones practice first, except in their first game (Saturday) where a coin toss will determine which team practices first.
6. At the conclusion of the team's pre-game practice, two different players deliver stones to the tee at the home end; the first stone with a clockwise rotation and the second stone with a counter-clockwise rotation. The distances are combined to determine the LSD for that game. The team with the lesser Last Stone Draw (LSD) distance has the choice of delivering first or second stone in the first end. If the LSD totals for both teams are the same, the individual LSD stones are compared and the best non-equal LSD has the choice of delivering first or second stone in the first end. When both teams have the exact same individual LSD stone distances, a coin toss will be used to determine that choice.
7. First named team in each draw plays stones with dark-coloured handles, and should wear dark-coloured upper playing garments. Note: red is considered a dark colour. Second named teams in each draw play the stones with the light-coloured handles and should wear light-coloured upper playing garments.
8. The Chief Umpire will determine the ice and other game details for all post round robin games as soon as the opponents have been determined.
9. **NOTE:** There are no tie-breaker games, but this schedule allows the possibility for three teams to qualify for the play-offs from each group and it is possible for all three to win medals. This is preferred in case the best three teams have all been placed in the same group by using the mandatory format for determining the groups.
